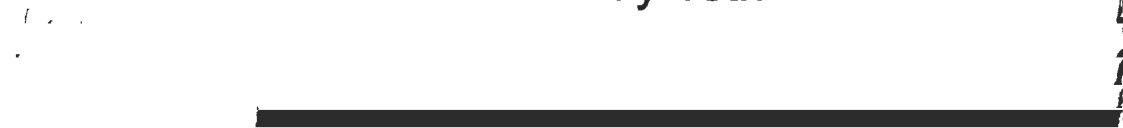

A. I'm not sure but I hope to have a close friend of mine come to the actual

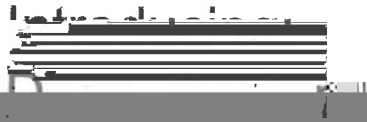
